


1Q24 Industrial Market

- Nearly 866 million SF of space.
- 2.6 million were delivered to the market
- 3.5 million square feet of new construction started.
- Excluding the TJX lease, the companies leasing or renewing were comprised of 39% third party logistics companies, 24% food service and 22% wholesale/retails companies.




Normalized Volume Growth & Seasonality

2023 Volumes 4.4% Higher Compared to Pre-Pandemic 2019 Volumes






2023 Volumes Align with Port Master Plan Forecast







LABOR DEVELOPMENTS

Labor Developments – There are two Longshore Contracts in each port.

- A The Master Contract which cover all ports: Wages, Healthcare, Jurisdiction
- **B A Local Contract: Pension, Other Welfare, Local Conditions**
- Current contracts CBA between the NYSA and ILA expire September 30, 2024
- Local Contract in NY&NJ is completed:
 - Absenteeism
 - Productivity
- Most other ports are still negotiating their local contracts
 - May 17th deadline
- Master Contract discussion will resume once the Local Contracts are near completion



LABOR DEVELOPMENTS

- The volume pendulum certainly swung in 2023 and this had a dramatic effect on the longshore labor developments in the port. We quickly went from daily shortages and a burned-out workforce to having a surplus of longshoremen
- The port was short, hundreds of workers a day, to having a surplus on a
 daily average basis of about 400 workers. Our focus in 2024 has gone from
 trying to bring new workers into the industry, to WORKER RETENTION.
 - All of these workers went through the on-boarding process, which can be a time-consuming process in our port.
 - Most left other jobs to become longshoremen.
 - Spent millions of dollars training these workers to drive specialized machinery.
 - The bottom line is we don't want to lose them to other industries or jobs. The average attrition rate on the LS side on average is about 100 workers per year.
- If normal growth occurs these workers should find a more permanent home or sustainable income in a couple of years.



OVERSITE TRANSITION TO THE NEW JERSEY STATE POLICE

- The Waterfront Commission of New York Harbor (WCNYH)was an obstacle to port hiring and was very "New York centric. Currently approximately 5% of port activity takes place in New York.
- The WCNYH was more focused on justifying their existence rather than the good of the port.
- Governor Christie signed Legislation eliminating the WCNHY as he was leaving office and moved the Port oversight to the New Jersey State Police.
- Governor Murphy enacted the Legislation.
- The State of New York rejected, and the dispute was decided by the United States Supreme Court where New Jersey prevailed.
- July 17th 2023, the professional, modern, well resourced NJSP took over port oversight in New Jersey.



2023 TRAINING DEVELOPMENTS

The reduced volume allowed us to catch up on training to give workers more potential opportunities.

In 2023 we issued 825 new certifications and 2,130 recertifications

That's new workers achieving multiple skills.

There is also a classroom training requirement.

- Hazardous cargo training
- Respect and dignity training
- Power industrial truck
- C M A .. C G Terminal fundamentals training

On the classroom side, we were able to train or retrain nearly 2,000 workers.

 educators and institutions on how local residents can prepare
 themselves for work opportunities in the supply chain.

Community Outreach

City of Newark - Commission on Homelessness.

- Initiated by Mayor Baraka. The CEO of PNCT is the Co-chair of the Commission.
- SANYNJ was asked to join as a Commissioner
- SANYNJ contribution has been mostly along the lines of organizational management and communication.
- Hope Village 2. A complex built from shipping containers modified to look like apartments to help people facing chronic homelessness get on their feet. The success of the program is in the numbers. Newark has reduced homelessness in their city by over 50%. They've been recognized nationally as a model on this issue and I'm proud that the port community can participate.

 - Port Marketing with Marine Terminal Operators






